Contingent of Eight Headed to D.C. for Massive Rally

Glenn Gast, Gene Finnegan, Rev. Lenore, Sue Nottke, John Rainey, Tim Work and our St. Stephen friends Ruth Novak and Jo Miller are traveling to Washington to participate in a Rally to End Racism on April 4th (the 50th anniversary of the assassination of Martin Luther King, Jr.). This is the beginning of a sweeping initiative by the National Council of Churches to end racism that will unfold over several years. The initiative is designed to discover and declare the complicity of the mainline church in perpetuating racism.


Some of them will talk about their experience at the Thursday, April 5th, Study Group prior to the viewing of the movie 12 Years A Slave. All are welcome to join them at 6:30 p.m. in the Boardman Room.

The film is based on an incredible true story of a free black man from upstate New York being abducted and sold into slavery. He struggles for 12 years to stay alive and retain his dignity. Then a chance meeting with a Canadian abolitionist alters his life forever.



APRIL STUDY GROUP SESSIONS

Following the session described above, the Group will begin a five-part study, *Fear vs. Faith: A Faith Response to Gun Violence.* While exploring the topic members will also discuss the speeches presented by the students at the March for Our Lives event March 24th. 
