HELP SAMMY HELP THE HOMELESS

Sammy Greenman (our confirmation class) will be attending a youth overnighter at the Vermilion UCC February 22nd to help Denison Avenue UCC help the homeless! Games, activities, and presentations will focus on the issue of housing insecurity.

Citing several code violations, including the lack of a sprinkler and fire alarm system, on Christmas Eve the City of Cleveland ordered the church to stop allowing homeless people to spend the night in the church building. They usually host as many as 50 homeless persons on a given night. The church has appealed the legal order, but they need funding for the building upgrades and legal expenses.

The overnighter participants are challenged to each raise \$100 for Denison's needs. They are also encouraged to collect new hygiene items (toothpaste, soap, etc.) and new or gently used warm clothing for Denison's clients. New socks and underwear are especially appreciated!

Let's help Sammy prove that our confirmation class, like our congregation, is small but mighty by giving him an abundance of donations to take with him. He will be collecting money and items February 2, 9 and 16 and will report back to the congregation about his total collection and what he learned about housing insecurity during worship on March 1st.
