
Please join me in looking to 2020 with eager anticipation of what God has in store for us! Shalom.

PLEASE stay after worship on January 5<sup>th</sup> to take down the Christmas decorations.



Study Group Begins a New 6-Week Course

# INTRODUCING THE NEW TESTAMENT

Have you always wanted to learn more about Jesus and the New Testament but never took advantage of the opportunity to do it? If so, now is the time to check that off your to-do list!

The Study Group will begin a 6-week course from the Massachusetts Bible Society titled *Introducing the New Testament* Thursday, January 9<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m.. You will spend an hour and a half each week learning about Jesus as a man, as a Jewish rabbi, and as the Christ of Christian faith. Along with others who want to test the waters of biblical studies, you will also explore first-century Nazareth, what ancient letter-writing practices can tell us about Paul's letters, and the wild apocalypse of Revelation.

There is considerable reading involved with this course, so if you plan to participate, please see Rev. Lenore for a copy of the study book. You may also just take a look at the contents of the book to determine if you want to commit to the work involved in getting the most out of joining the group.

Other members of the group would be happy to give you insight into what they experienced in the two previous courses in this series *Exploring the Bible*.
