As a tribute to this amazing mother of six, who lived faithfully for 98 years, I want to share the following poem. It gives insight into who she was, and who I strive to be. Without access to a copier, she wrote it out by hand on note paper. Above the title she wrote "My favorite poem." It was written by Grace Crowell (1877-1969), a popular American poet. Back in the day her work appeared in hundreds of magazines and newspapers.

The first Church Life meeting was held February 9th. Until the beginning of next year this will replace the monthly Leadership Team meeting.

Scarlet Berry, our Treasurer, attended to the first item of business, familiarizing every one with the details of the monthly finance report. Rev. Lenore reported that the AA group has resumed their meetings and the Unitarians are renting some storage space from us so that will increase our monthly income a little.

The lawsuit against the former buyer of the old building who backed out has not progressed. We are still waiting for our attorney to give us a cost estimate for filing in Franklin County so we can decide whether to file there or in Erie County. It will be a lengthy process with probably little financial gain for us, but by suing we may be able to keep someone else from being taken advantage of by this "sham company."

There have been more maintenance issues at the old building. Robin took care of them temporarily.

Both the Board of Mission & Outreach and the Fund Raising Committee need more members. This needs to be brought to the congregation's attention.

There was a discussion about how we will go about promoting the church once the pandemic is over in an effort to get new members. It was suggested that we advertise in the Serving Our Seniors magazine. It is widely distributed and no church advertises in it.

We need to have a Congregational Meeting on February 14th so members can vote on the offer that was recently made to purchase our old building. It is a sound offer and falls within the guidelines set by the Leadership Team. We will not be financing the purchase. If all goes according to plan, we will receive \$204,812.50 after the fees and expenses are paid. Of course, we have learned that nothing is a done deal until the process is complete.
